feel right at home in the comfortable, pristine suite, and the gracious VIP concierge **Merlyn Taggert** is ready to accommodate any special requests.


The spa at Bacara is recognized as one of the finest in the world. It's huge. Over 42,000 square feet of saunas, steam rooms and sun decks. You'll find over 60 treatments to choose from. I suggest indulging in the signature Body Melt, and followed by a soak in the saline hydrotherapy

bath. The fitness center sports some serious gym equipment, private Pilates and yoga studios, and elegant changing rooms, luxuriously stocked with Frette robes and slippers.

A grand afternoon tea is served fireside in the lobby, and there are three great restaurants. Try Miro, where Chef Johan Denizot prepares seasonal dishes using locally grown organic vegetables. Mr. Tyson Torres, the knowledgeable restaurant manager, will walk your through their collection of over 1,200 wines.

While there, I also suggest taking a wine-tasting day trip to the beautiful vineyards of Santa Inez and Los Olivos. Located just a few minutes away, you'll be able to sample some of California's finest gems.
